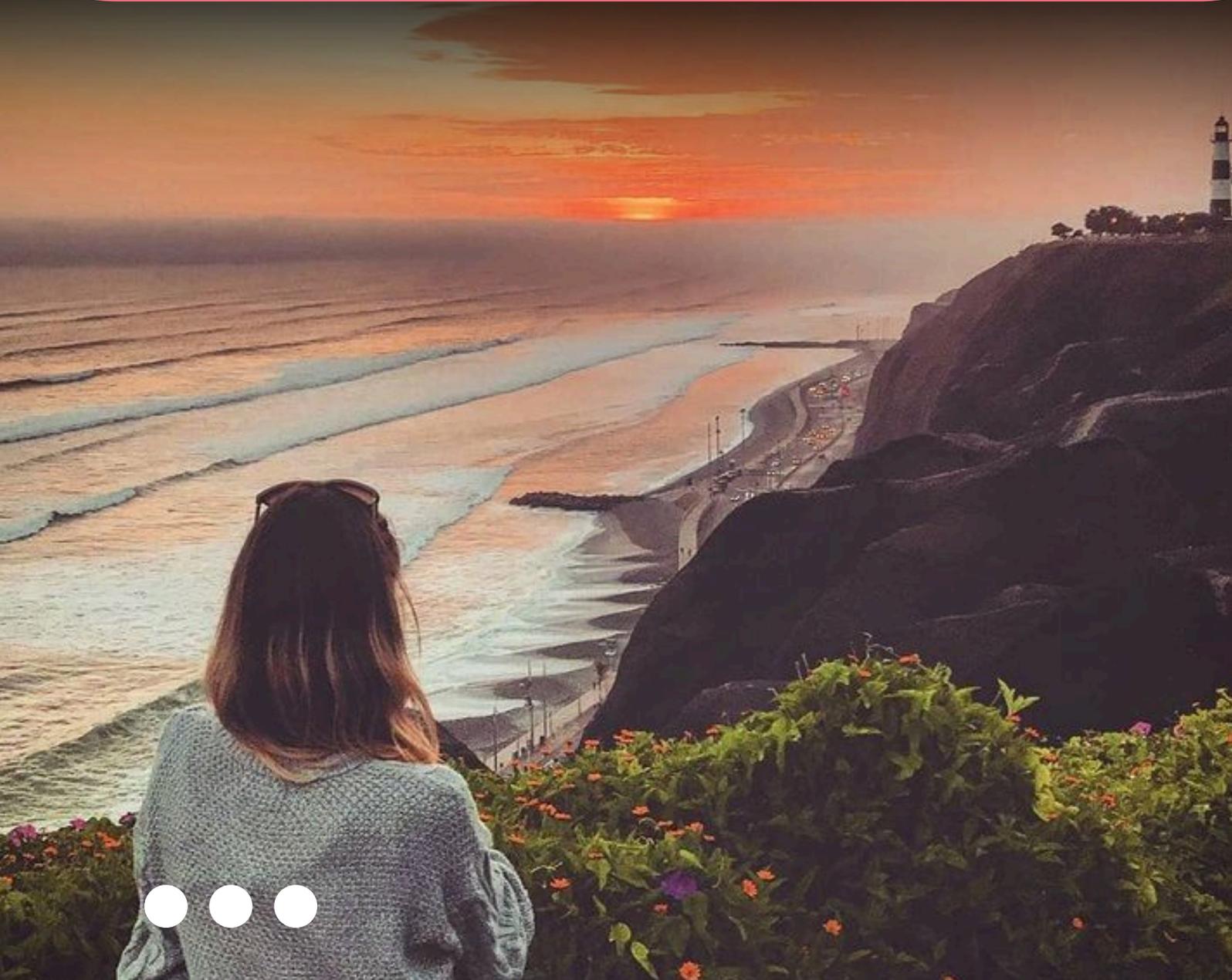

# ITINERARY

## DAY 1

6 June 2026

### Arrival in Lima

- Arrive in Lima, meet & greet at airport
- Transfer to hotel and relax
- Evening free to stroll around Miraflores or enjoy a light dinner at Huaca Pucllana Restaurant (optional)

## DAY 2

7 June 2026

### Explore Barranco (artsy neighborhood with murals and Puente de los Suspiros)

- Arabica Espresso Bar
- Central or Maido (book in advance)
- Relax by the Malecón or enjoy a sunset view over the Pacific

## DAY 3

8 June 2026

### Flight to Cusco & Easy Day

- Morning flight Lima → Cusco
- Transfer to hotel, check-in
- Rest and acclimatize to altitude
- Light evening walk around Plaza de Armas

## DAY 4

9 June 2026

### Cusco City Tour

- Morning guided tour: Qoricancha (Temple of the Sun), Sacsayhuamán & nearby ruins
- Afternoon free to shop at San Blas artisan market or relax in a café

## **DAY 5**

10 June 2026

### Sacred Valley Tour

- Visit Pisac market, Pisac ruins, Ollantaytambo fortress
- Check-in at Sacred Valley hotel, relax & enjoy the peaceful setting

## **DAY 6**

11 June 2026

### Train to Aguas Calientes

- Morning scenic train ride to Aguas Calientes
- Free day to relax, explore the town, visit hot springs, or shop for handicrafts
- Overnight in Aguas Calientes

## **DAY 7**

12 June 2026

### Machu Picchu Day

- Early morning guided tour of Machu Picchu
- Afternoon free to hike Huayna Picchu or relax in the citadel area
- Overnight again in Aguas Calientes (no rushing back to Cusco!)

### Return to Cusco + Fly to Lima

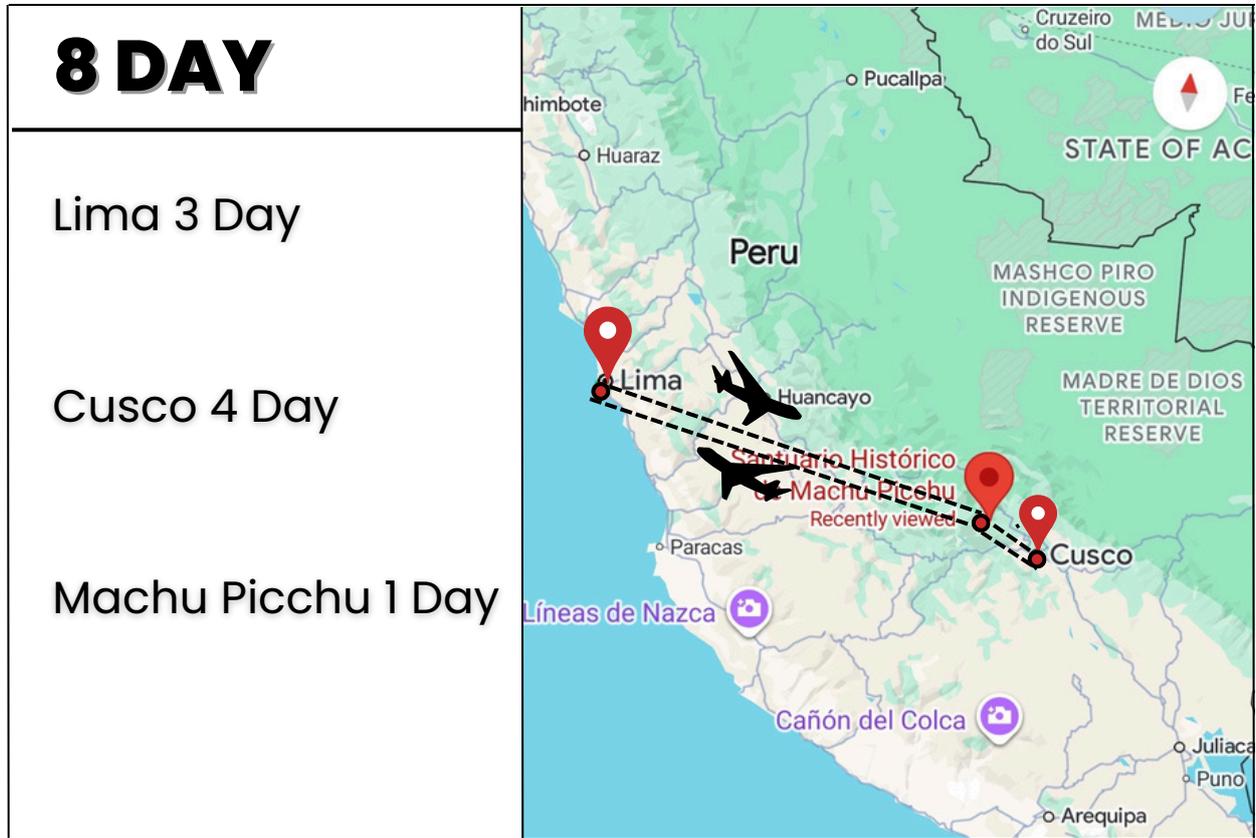
- Morning train back to Ollantaytambo, transfer to Cusco

# THINGS TO REMEMBER

## Safety

1. Stay Alert in Big Cities – Peru has incredible history and culture, but cities like Lima and Cusco also have pickpocketing and petty theft. Avoid showing valuables and stay in well-populated, tourist-friendly areas.
2. Keep Your Hotel Info Handy – Always carry your hotel's address and phone number. It's useful if you get lost, need help, or need to direct a taxi or Uber driver.
3. Don't Flash Jewelry or Electronics – Pickpocketing is common in busy areas, markets, and public transport. Use your phone and camera discreetly, especially in crowded places.
4. Avoid Certain Neighborhoods Without a Guide – Some areas are fine during the day but unsafe at night. If exploring outside main tourist zones, go with a trusted local guide or organized tour.
5. Use ATMs Inside Malls or Banks – Avoid street ATMs, especially after dark. Use machines inside shopping centers or bank branches for added security.
6. Group Responsibility – If you choose to separate from the group, you do so at your own risk. Please inform the tour leader if you plan to step away.
7. Personal Belongings – The tour is not responsible for lost, stolen, or damaged personal items. Keep valuables secure at all times.

## Food & Health

**8.** Tap Water Isn't Safe to Drink – Always drink bottled or filtered water. Avoid ice unless you're at a reputable restaurant or hotel.

**9.** Try Local Dishes, But Watch Hygiene – Ceviche, lomo saltado, and aji de gallina are must-tries. Stick to busy restaurants with high turnover.

**10.** Watch Portions & Altitude – Portions can be large, and in high-altitude areas like Cusco, eat lighter meals your first day to help your body adjust.

## Clothing

**11.** Dress in Layers, Respect Local Norms – Weather changes quickly, especially in Cusco and Machu Picchu. Wear breathable layers. Modest clothing is expected in churches and historical sites.

**12.** Comfort Over Fashion – Comfortable walking or hiking shoes are essential. Rain jackets, hats, and sun protection matter more than dressing up.



# TRAVEL POLICY HANDBOOK

Welcome to our travel with Maysa community! We're thrilled to embark on exciting adventures together. Please review our tour policies to ensure a safe, enjoyable, and harmonious experience for all travelers.

**1. Conduct and Behavior:** Respectful communication is paramount for fostering fairness and admiration among all members. Individuals who create conflict or spread negativity and if continues recipe waring may ask to leave in order to maintain harmony within the group.

Negative behaviors such as humiliation, bullying, verbal abuse, discrimination, harassment, manipulation, and others are strictly prohibited .

**4. Flexibility and Departure:** Travelers have the option to exit the tour at hey desier any time by completing an exit form, after which the tour assumes no further responsibility. Understand that no refunds will be provided for early departures .

**5. Accommodations and Special Needs:** Please inform us of any specific limitations or special needs, particularly for travelers with physical, emotional, or mental disabilities, so the leader can provide assistance accordingly .

**6. Communication and Connectivity:** It is travelers responsibility to have access to Wi-Fi and a workable phone at all times during the trip to ensure effective communication with tour leaders and fellow travelers, as well as for emergency situations .

### **Deposit and Cancellation Policy**

- A non-refundable deposit is due five (5) months prior to the trip.
- In the event of cancellation, the deposit will be credited to the Traveler's travel account, valid for one year from the original trip date .
- A second non-refundable deposit is due three (3) months prior to the trip.
- In the event of cancellation, this deposit is non-refundable .

Replacement Clause:
