



THINGS TO REMEMBER



Safety

1. Stay Alert in Big Cities – Countries like Brazil have beautiful sights but also areas with high crime rates. Avoid displaying valuables and stay in well-populated, tourist-friendly areas.
2. Keep Your Hotel Info Handy – Always carry your hotel's address and phone number. If you get lost or need help, it's easy to get assistance or direct a taxi/driver.
3. Don't Flash Jewelry or Electronics – Petty theft, such as pickpocketing, is common. Keep your phone and camera usage discreet, especially in crowded areas.
4. Avoid Favelas Without a Guide – While some favelas are open to tourists, only visit with a trusted local guide or organized tour.
5. Use ATMs Inside Malls or Banks – Avoid using ATMs on the street, especially after dark. Opt for machines located inside shopping centers or bank branches.

Food


6. Tap Water Isn't Safe to Drink – Always drink bottled or filtered water. Avoid ice from unknown sources.
7. Try Local Dishes, But Watch Hygiene – Feijoada, pão de queijo, and moqueca are must-tries, but stick to busy restaurants or street vendors with a high turnover to avoid food poisoning.
8. Portions Can Be Huge – Many restaurants serve meals for two people. Sharing is common and a good way to try more dishes.

Clothing

9. Dress Light, But Respect Local Norms – Brazil is hot and humid, so wear light, breathable fabrics. In churches or upscale restaurants, modest or semi-formal attire is more appropriate.
10. Beachwear Is for the Beach – Bikinis and flip-flops are normal at the beach, but not for restaurants or city streets. Pack a cover-up or casual outfit for post-beach outings.

TRAVEL POLICY HANDBOOK

Welcome to our travel with Maysa community! We're thrilled to embark on exciting adventures together. Please review our tour policies to ensure a safe, enjoyable, and harmonious experience for all travelers.

1. **Conduct and Behavior:** Respectful communication is paramount for fostering fairness and admiration among all members. - A second non-refundable deposit is due three (3) months prior to the trip.
- In the event of cancellation, this deposit is non-refundable .


